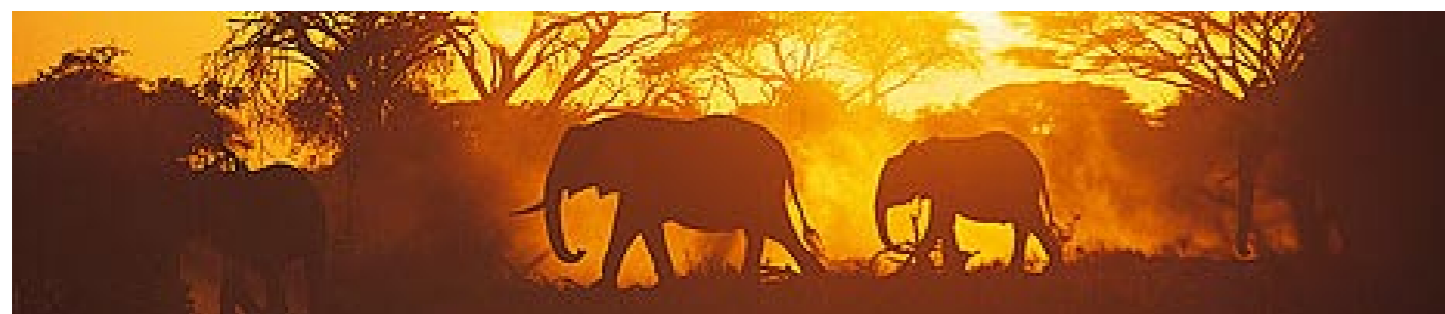

GOLFING TOUR OF SOUTH AFRICA'S WESTERN CAPE



ITINERARY

April 2010

Fri 16th Depart Perth 2350 on South African Airways SA281 (Business class) Arriving into Johannesburg at 0510 on the 17 April.

Sat 17th Upon arrival Johannesburg transfer to SA313 departing Johannesburg at 0800 and arriving Cape Town 1010. Following arrival you will be transferred to the magnificent Table Bay Hotel. The afternoon is free and this evening at 1830 meet for a welcome cocktail party. Dinner tonight is at leisure.

Sun 18th This morning following a leisurely breakfast you will depart the hotel and head to the wine growing region of the Cape. Boschendal Wine Estate is our stop for lunch which promises to be one to remember. This vineyard is certainly five star in every way. Later in the afternoon there will be an opportunity to undertake a "Wine Farm" tour. After returning to Cape Town The evening is free and dinner is at leisure.

Mon 19th Today is the first of your five rounds of golf. Heading out of Cape Town (approx 20min drive) to the Steenberg (which means Mountain of Stone). This course is set under beautiful mountain surrounds with the course meandering through some of South Africa's oldest vineyards. This is 6296m par 72 and boasts some of the best greens you will find. The first group to tee off at 1100. For any non golfers today it is your first opportunity to experience the wonderful Shopping at the Cape Town Waterfront (which is adjacent to the hotel). Tonight at 1930 there is a group dinner at Beluga's Restaurant

Tue 20th This morning following a leisurely breakfast you will have the opportunity to see why Capetown is often referred to as the jewel in the crown of South Africa visiting the sites of this beautiful city including Table Mountain from which you have magnificent views over Capetown and the surrounding area. This afternoon is free and the evening is at leisure.

Wed 21st Heading east towards your next golf resort (Arabella). Departure from Cape Town at 1100 and arriving at the Arabella Western Cape Hotel in Hermanus early afternoon. Arabella is set inland on the southern coast and boasts magnificent views There is a welcome cocktail function at 1830 followed by dinner at the hotel at 2030.

Thu 22nd Following breakfast today is the second round of golf. The tee off time will again be 1100. This course offers a variety of challenges. In 2006 Arabella was voted the second best golf course in South Africa and regarded as the Western Capes number one challenge. It is for men a 6082m par 72 and for the ladies 5107m. For non golfers there will be spa treatment times booked throughout the day. This evening there is a dinner at the hotel at 2000.

Fri 23rd Again with a hearty breakfast and having the past two nights at Arabella it is time to move on. Departing Arabella at 1000 heading further east to the world famous Fancourt (approx 3.5 hrs travelling). Fancourt (which was voted the best resort in the world in 2004) is situated just out of George. Again you will have a welcome cocktail function in the club bar and followed by dinner in La Cantina Restaurant (Italian Style).

Sat 24th The third round of golf today and the first at the world renowned Fancourt Hotel and Country Club the home of the 2003 Presidents Cup. This course in 2000 was voted the best course in South Africa. With an 1130 tee off it is to be played on the Montagu course a 6324m for men and 4947m for ladies. Again for those not wishing to play golf spa treatment times have been set throughout the day. Dinner tonight will be in the Le Pecheur restaurant (Seafood and Sushi)

Sun 25th Golf again today with another 1130 tee off and on the second course at Fancourt. Today playing the Outeniqua course which is 5996m for men and 4893m for ladies. This course has excellent water features and creeks coupled with both up and down hill challenges. Again for those not playing golf the spa treatments will be available to you. Dinner tonight at 2000 in the Sansibar restaurant (a true African experience)

Mon 26th After breakfast today just a short drive to Knysna for the fifth and final round of golf at the Simola Golf and Country Resort. This course was officially opened by its designer the "The Golden Bear" in September 2005. Knysna itself has been Voted South Africa's favourite town and the course as one of the golfing mecca's of South Africa. At 6318m for men and 4595m for ladies. The views when playing this course are nothing short of stunning whether it be over hills and valleys or the famous Knysna Lagoon. Tee off again will be at 1130 and for those not wishing to play golf there will be the opportunity to partake in some shopping in Knysna itself or a lake excursion. Dinner tonight is back at Fancourt at 2000 in the Links Lodge.

Tue 27th With the golfing now complete you head further East to the spectacular private game reserve Shamwari. Shamwari has seven lodges, all of five star quality. The particular one that we are staying in is Long Mee Manor. The reserve has been voted the World's Leading game reserve and conservation company for eleven years running. With an early afternoon arrival there will be time to relax before heading off on the first game drive. Shamwari does boast having the big five. Following this it is back to the lodge and time to settle into a superb dinner with a few drinks (it is all included). It is important to note that Shamwari is a malaria free area.

Wed 28th A suggestion that you rise early and partake in another game viewing drive as the chances of seeing more variety of wild life will be enhanced the more you go. As this is a complete resort you can relax for the rest of the day around the pool or simply read a book. There is plenty of time here to unwind but do not forget there will be another game drive at dusk and followed by dinner. Following dinner you can sit back and enjoy a few drinks and swap stories about the past twelve days. Tonight is the last night before you head for home.

Thur 29th With breakfast at leisure it is time to start the journey home. Departing Shamwari late morning so that we arrive Port Elizabeth by 1300. Depart Port Elizabeth at 1525 on SA 420 arriving Johannesburg at 1705. Change aircraft and continue to Perth departing Johannesburg at 2150 on SA280 (Business Class).

Fri 30th Arrive Perth at 1325.

Jeff Newman OA

Jeff is a well known WA identity as he has been in the media arena since 1967 when he first joined TVW Channel Seven.

As one of Perth's most popular personalities Jeff has been involved in both roles of management and as a presenter and recently made the decision to retire as the nightly weather man for Channel 7. During his journey through television Jeff was awarded five logies as the state's most popular male personality

Apart from his commitment to television Jeff has been the anchor for 38 of the 42 annual telethon appeals. He was awarded Order of Australia Medal in 1994 for his contribution and continues to be a Trustee of the Board of Telethon. In addition Jeff is also a Paul Harris Fellow and was awarded The Centenary Medal in 2002 for services to the community.

Now that Jeff is retired from the public arena he intends to spend a little more time with the two loves of his life (Pat his wife of 42 years and enjoying an afternoon game of golf and in lieu of with a few drinks after with friends).



Barry Richards

Barry was born in Durban in 1945 and is considered by many as one of the best cricketers to ever play the game. To support this Sir Don Bradman rated Barry in the top three post war batsmen and the best right handed batsman ever. He chose Barry as his opening batsman in his personal selection of his best ever team of the century

With over 28,000 runs in first class cricket including 80 centuries and over 170 half centuries and a career average of 55.00 it is little wonder he is rated so highly. This coincidentally excluded Kerry Packer's World Series of 1977/78 which was never recognized as first class cricket.

During the years of South Africa's isolation from the international arena Barry played Sheffield Shield for South Australia with some amazing statistics including his 356 runs against Western Australia at the WACA which included 325 on the first day in 320 minutes with 198 coming from boundaries. This was all achieved facing some of WA's best including Graham McKenzie, Dennis Lillee, Tony Lock, John Iverarity and Ian Bradshaw.

Barry was chosen as the Wisden Cricketer of the year in 1969 and was included in the first 50 inductees in the international hall of fame Following his retirement as a player Barry became involved in cricket administration as director of cricket for Natal in South Africa.

On moving to Australia in 1989 he coached South Australia to a Sheffield Shield final then subsequently moved to Queensland Cricket as Chief Executive Officer. The fruits of Barry's efforts were evident in 1994 when Queensland won the Sheffield Shield for the first time in 67 years. They then went on to win another four over the following seven years. Barry returned to Western Australia and although he resides in Perth travels to South Africa on a regular basis. Today Barry is a highly respected freelance commentator and corporate speaker.
